The Marshall County Board of Education met in workshop session Friday, January 27, 2012, 6:30 p.m., at the Offices of the Board of Education, all members having been notified of business to be considered.

Present were: President Roger A. Lewicki; Vice President David L. Hall; Members Thomas E. Gilbert, Jr., Lori E. Kestner, and Beth A. Phillips; Secretary Alfred N. Renzella; Members of the County Administrative Staff.

Holly Woods and Mary Kay Wensyel presented information about the recent Acuity benchmark that was conducted county wide grades 3-9 and grade 11. Overall results showed an improvement in students working in Tiers III and IV. It showed an increase from last year. Discussion was held with Ms. Woods about Math I that replaces Algebra in grade 9. The results were given about benchmark 2 in Dibels. Overall the county shows slight improvement in all grade levels. Our goal is to reach 95 percent county wide in benchmark 2 and we are still working toward that goal.

Carla Garrison reported on the amount of technology that is being used in Marshall County. There are many programs and it is hard for teachers to use them all.

Dr. Susan Jones reviewed WESTEST 2 results from last spring.

Marilyn Dague compared legal notices for attendance from the 10-11 to 11-12 school years from Cameron.
