The Marshall County Board of Education met in workshop session Tuesday, November 19, 6:30 p.m., at the Offices of the Board of Education, all members having been notified of business to be considered.

Present were: President Roger A. Lewicki, Vice President Lori E. Kestner, Members Thomas E. Gilbert, Jr., John Miller, Beth A. Phillips; Secretary Michael Hince.

Also present were Larry Dunn, Rick Milhoan, Ron Blatt, Travis Arey, Jody Driggs and Brian Estep.

The purpose of the workshop is to review and discuss the design of John Marshall High School Renovations provided by Silling and discuss concerns at Cameron High School.

Silling presented four different options for the school's entrance and a design for the walkway between the main building and the school's center for performing arts. Silling proposed reducing the science labs from ten to eight to save cost. The building will include front stairs from the first to third floors and departmentalizes the room configurations to accommodate better collaboration.

The Board addressed reported concerns regarding Cameron High School listed in the newspaper. Ron Blatt (PCS), clarified the erroneous report. There was one area on the roof that had a leak. The roof is under warranty and Kalkreuth, the roofing company, is addressing the problem. Other concerns were exaggerated, or already corrected, prior to the Local School Improvement Report.

A workshop was scheduled for December 16, 2013 (6:30 p.m.) for Silling to present costs on the designs.

Motion by Mr. Miller, and seconded by Mrs. Phillips, that the meeting be adjourned. Motion carried.

President Lewicki adjourned the workshop at 8:30 p.m.
