In the summer of 2024, the administration of Marshall County Schools released a professional development catalog containing the details of all summer trainings including who is eligible, deadlines and how to register. We had overwhelmingly positive feedback from this; so we have continued in that procedure.

Each page in this document describes a professional development opportunity, timelines, compensation, criteria to be eligible to register, and directions on how to register. Not every training is for every employee. The qualifications for eligibility of each training are listed.

It is not mandatory for any training to be completed for stipend pay; these are simply opportunities for personal growth that will positively impact student performance. If a training is mandatory per state code, anyone who does not complete the training for pay will simply have to complete that training during a designated professional development day built into the school calendar.


If you are earning a stipend for training, the work must be completed outside of your contracted work hours.

DESCRIPTION

by Jonathan Haidt

In The Anxious Generation, social psychologist Jonathan Haidt lays out the facts about the epidemic of teen mental illness that hit many countries at the same time. He then investigates the nature of childhood, including why children need play and independent exploration to mature into competent, thriving adults. Haidt shows how the "play-based childhood" began to decline in the 1980s, and how it was finally wiped out by the arrival of the "phone-based childhood" in the early 2010s. He presents more than a dozen mechanisms by which this "great rewiring of childhood" has interfered with children's social and neurological development, covering everything from sleep deprivation to attention fragmentation, addiction, loneliness, social contagion, social comparison, and perfectionism. He explains why social media damages girls more than boys and why boys have been withdrawing from the real world into the virtual world, with disastrous consequences for themselves, their families, and their societies.

DESCRIPTION

A CPI training certification, which stands for "Crisis Prevention Institute" training certification, signifies that an individual has completed a program designed to teach them how to recognize, prevent, and de-escalate potentially dangerous situations through techniques like verbal intervention and safe physical intervention strategies, prioritizing the safety of both themselves and others involved in a crisis; this certification is often required for professionals working in healthcare, education, and security fields where managing challenging behaviors may occur.
